




# Nevada County Pedestrian Master Plan

### **Project Summary:**

The grant develops a Nevada County Pedestrian Master Plan with the involvement of the public and stakeholders to identify gaps or locations where the existing pedestrian infrastructure is inadequate or does not exist. Additionally, the Master Plan guides the prioritization of infrastructure investments, leverages funding, expands transportation choices, and promotes livable communities that reflect community values. The Pedestrian Master Plan culminates with a report of policies, design guidelines, technical findings, and a financing scheme.

### **Community Outreach**

- Held two public workshops - one in Nevada City and one in Truckee to gather feedback from stakeholders on existing barriers to pedestrian travel and desired improvements.
- Facilitated booths at the Nevada County and Truckee Farmers Markets.
- Distributed comment cards at public workshops, market booths, and online.
- Posted an online survey for residents who were unable to attend the public workshops.
- Conducted walking audits at two points during the project- after kick-off and after the public workshops. The walk audits included staff from the NCTC, City of Grass Valley, City of Nevada City, Town of Truckee, and members of the public.

### **Project Outcome**

- The Nevada County Pedestrian Improvement Plan is intended to guide and influence pedestrian infrastructure, policies, programs, and development standards to make walking in Nevada County more safe, comfortable, convenient, and enjoyable for all pedestrians.

### **Successes & Next Steps**

- The grant was completed nearly 1-year early.
- The Nevada County Pedestrian Master Plan provides a project list which will help leverage funding for future projects identified in the report.
- This document will guide decision-makers in deciding priorities for projects listed within the report.
